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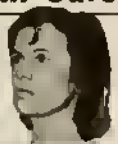

Churchgoers were astounded when they responded to the cries of a child coming from behind a church altar — and discovered an adorable toddler abandoned there.

The little boy, about 15 months old, wore a gold bracelet with the name Austin. He was found in the

Publicity and police investigations eventually established the dark-haired baby's identity, but Hancock said he wasn't permitted to divulge anything.

Weirdo caller tricks women into cutting off their hair

CLIPPED! CRUEL PHONE HOAX LEAVES GALS BALD!

TRUSTING Lisa Hansen followed caller's instructions and cut off her hair. Now she has to wear a wig, right.

Gullible Lisa Hansen was one of several unsuspecting women who got phone calls from a strange man — and wound up bald. The caller told the poor woman she had been exposed to a dangerous toxic chemical and reports needed samples of her hair so they could run tests to neutralize the condition.

Before she smiled at some one who pulled her leg, the Bismarck, N. Dakota, woman had snipped off all the hair on her head. Now she has to wear a wig to cover her bald spot.

"I am really embarrassed," said Lisa Hansen, one of at least six women who got calls from the sinister hoaxes. "I don't want this to happen to anyone else."

Announcers say the victims — all women working in the area from 21 to 41 — described the caller as totally believable. The man identified himself as an employee of a local hospital and seemed to know a great deal about the women he was speaking to.

"He told them they had been chemically contaminated

by someone in their family," Detective Sgt. Anderson of the Bismarck Police Department said *The NEWS*. "He said they had to supply hair samples, that they had to cut off their hair off."

"Some of the women did it, some didn't. We're investigating the case, but we haven't caught very far."

The first hoax was allegedly done, police say, in early January this month, who identified himself as a medical worker, used a similar technique.

In Lisa Hansen's case, the man said that his husband from a while she was separated — had been diagnosed with the malignant with PCB contamination. He said doctors were worried she might be contaminating, too, and asked her to cut

off a two-inch square swatch of hair from the front of her head.

"Cut close to the scalp," he said, according to his victim.

Then he instructed her to cut a second swatch and all third.

Then he laughed and told her it was all a joke.

"She'd cut down to a very short man's haircut, but certainly wasn't a professional looking job," said Lyle Loefer, who said Mrs. Hansen and two other women urge to cover their embarrassing haircuts.

"It's definitely very short. It will be at least three months before these women can go without wigs."

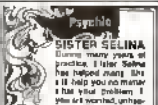

Space expert tells his wife during custody fight: I'll put the kids in orbit before you get them!

A rocket scientist planned to launch his children into outer space rather than let his wife take custody of them after they were divorced.

Incredibly, police said Dr. Axel Lebeck came closer to carrying out his scheme than his wife and the authorities would like to think.

He allegedly smuggled at least \$1 million in rocket parts from a top aerospace firm so as to actually assemble the spaceship in a field behind his farm.

"It's hard to imagine but the man was dead serious about putting his two children in orbit," Inspector Peter Kesting told reporters in Mari, West Germany.

He stole the rockets, parts and components from his employer. He had a complete engine in his barn just

waiting to be installed when we caught him."

Dr. Lebeck did it only the shell of his alleged intentions. He told reporters that he was dead set against his estranged wife taking custody of their children and

was willing to go to any lengths to prevent it.

"I have nothing to apologize for," said the 52-year-old scientist.

"Everybody knows that the mother gets the children when a couple divorces."

"I just couldn't let that happen — not without a fight, anyway."

The expert was charged with grand theft of the rocket parts and released from jail on his own recognizance. His children, Maria, 13, and Jora, 11, were unavailable for comment.

But Stasi Lebeck, his 42-year-old wife, lashed out at Lebeck — claiming that the scientist's plan to rocket

their children into space "was yet another example of the insanity" that prompted her to seek a divorce in the first place.

"Axel lives in a dream world," said Mrs. Lebeck. "I have no doubt that he would have asked the children to live with him in space."

"He doesn't care about anybody or anything — only himself."

The couple's divorce is expected to become final in early November. Their children, who had been living with Dr. Lebeck, have been sent to their mother by a judge's order.

Just what might have happened if the expert had tried

to launch his makeshift rocket will never be known, officials said.

But aerospace engineer Wilhelm Voss said the craft almost undoubtedly would have flown.

"Dr. Lebeck is a brilliant scientist and if he fell like the rocket would fly, I'm sure it would have," he said.

"Of course, the object of manned flight isn't merely to get people into space. Somehow you have to get them back."

"And I don't think he could have done that with the equipment he has a bit to steal from the plant."

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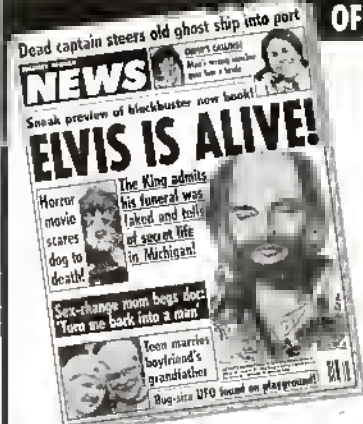

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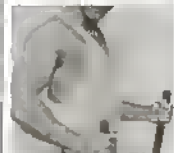

Russians sew chimp's head onto man's body!

By RAGAN BUNN

A human rights advocate says Soviet scientists have transplanted a chimp's head on a man's body in one of the most horrifying medical experiments on record.

"The Russians have never been restricted by ethics or respect for human life but this time they've gone too far," Dr. Herman Lusk told reporters in Amberg, West Germany.

"They conducted the transplant on August 20," he added, "and according to my sources, the patient is still alive."

Soviet officials angrily denounced Dr. Lusk's allegation but he produced both written and photographic evidence to support his claims.

Documents smuggled from a research facility east of Moscow contain a step-by-step description of the bizarre transplant experiment.

And a shocking series of photos taken after the operation clearly depict a human body topped with a chimp's neck and head.

Dr. Viktor Makinodov is a former Soviet surgeon who emigrated to West Germany last year. He told reporters that Soviet scientists have conducted head-transplant experiments to the peer and will continue to do so unless "God-fearing people everywhere pressure them to quit."

"The most recent transplant is particularly gruesome but it doesn't surprise me in the least," cautioned the doctor.

"I seriously doubt that the patient will live more than a few months because the animal head will almost certainly be rejected by the human body."

"But this sort of research is very important to the Soviet medical establishment and will definitely go on. It is part of an attempt to fuse life itself in the pursuit of ultimate power."

Western intelligence sources confirm that the Soviets have been con-

ducting head transplant experiments since the early 1950s. Similar research has been totally banned in the United States, they went on to say.

In spite of Soviet denials, Dr. Lusk has called on individuals and human rights groups worldwide to condemn the Soviet research.

"In the name of God and everything decent we've got to stop this madness," he said.

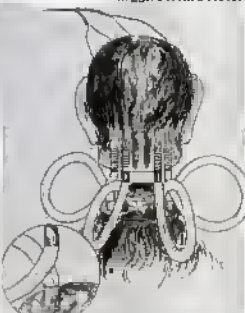

Child molester is let out of jail & does it again, say cops

In an outrageous court system screw-up, cops said a sex fiend kidnapped and molested two little boys while out on bail for the admitted rape of another child.

Richard Gardner, 21, was a free man for nearly two months after pleading guilty to the sexual assault of a 12-year-old boy in Hingham, Mass.

While a judge debated whether to give him prison or probation, police said Gardner slipped across the state line and assaulted two boys in Warwick, R.I.

"I asked the judge to increase Gardner's bail after he pled guilty, but apparently he didn't think the man was a risk," said Detective Andy Jean Holmes.

Gardner was arrested May 8 in Hingham for raping the 12-year-old. His mother posted

\$3,000 cash bail and he was released from jail, said Mrs. Holmes.

The case was delayed while shirking at a Bridgewater hospital tried to determine whether Gardner was sane enough to stand trial. They decided his was.

Gardner was hauled into court June 2 and docketed the crime. He was inched into on poverty again while Judge John Sheehan considered his sentence.

About 4 a.m. on July 29, a 10-year-old boy was asleep in the first-floor bedroom of his parents' home in Warwick, R.I. Police said Gardner's grab-

bed the boy from his bed, took him to a wooded area and assaulted him. The terrified youngster was dropped off near his home at dawn.

That night a 9-year-old Warwick boy was abducted by a man he knew from school, his brother and a friend. Police say the man was Richard Gardner.

The frightened little boy was sexually assaulted before the kidnapper released him just a block from his home 22 hours later.

Police spotted Gardner's car a few minutes later and captured him after a high-speed chase.

Gardner is currently being held WITHOUT BAIL, and is charged with first-degree sexual assault, second-degree sexual assault, two counts of kid-

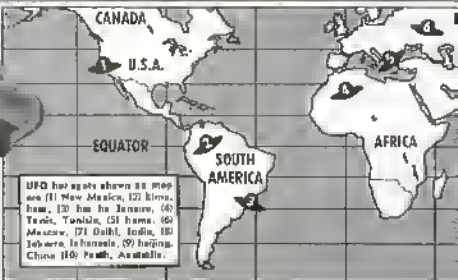

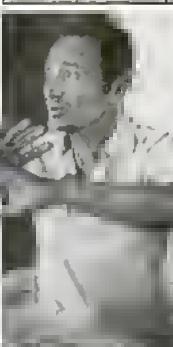

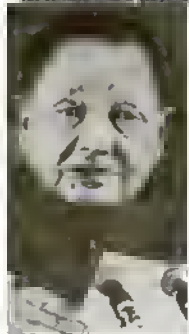

Desperate dad feared that getting a divorce would upset his kids

Cop tries to murder his wife!

A veteran police officer said he simply couldn't face the prospect of putting his two young sons through a messy divorce — and decided to have his wife murdered instead.

"I knew I could no longer live with Faye and I knew that I could not walk out on my sons," Hans Bredemann told Canadian authorities after his arrest in Edmonton.

Bredemann, 36, was sentenced to 10 years after pleading guilty to attempted murder charges in the attack on his wife, Faye, who was shot in the hand and stomach.

Officer Bredemann's 55-year-old girlfriend, Elizabeth McLean, is accused of pulling the trigger and is scheduled to be tried later this year.

In a statement to investigators, Bredemann said the murder plot was hatched in desperation — because he couldn't walk out on his marriage and leave his two young sons behind.

"I tried to explain the situation to them but they began to tremble and tears started forming in their eyes," Bredemann explained.

"That look on their faces has haunted me ever since and eventually desperation took its final course."

"I was possessed by a force that totally overcame me," the 17-year veteran at the Edmonton police force said.

"I'm the scariest guy in the world. I just couldn't see anything, you know, no way, no other way out," Bredemann said.

"God, it sounds crazy. Absolutely crazy, you know. Like I was in a Hitchcock movie," he said. "I just can't

went to answer his front doorbell in his early morning hours.

The intruder fired a shot that went through Mrs. Bredemann's hand and into her stomach, but the 39-year-old housewife struggled with the attacker, who dropped the gun and fled.

The gun, a .22-caliber rifle equipped with a homemade silencer, led to Bredemann's ar-

rest. "The detective later searched his workshop and found evidence that the silencer was made there by him," Martin said.

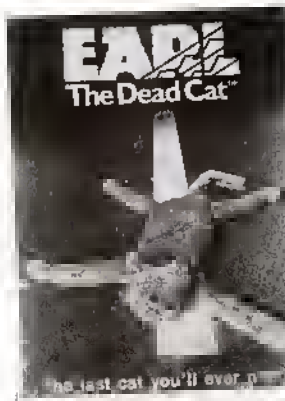

"Sick and depraved in how the society views Earl the Dead Cat," said Tom Hughes, Humane Society president.

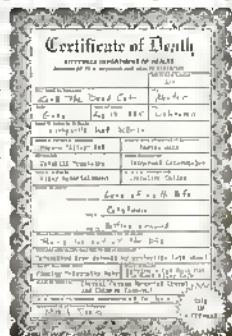
"The incidence of animal abuse appears to be on the increase, and this type of despicable toy will ultimately lead to more abuse," Hughes said.

Teen would rather die than marry old coot

Young bride says 'I don't' and eats nails to stop wedding!

A 14-year-old girl ate 63 nails, 20 bottle caps and a handful of gravel rather than submit to her father's demand that she marry an 80-year-old man!

"She was definitely trying to kill herself," Police Inspector Ahmad Harsanyi told reporters in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

"Presently, I think she could have chosen an easier method. She apparently went to agony to the hospital, where surgeons had to operate to save her."

The girl admitted that she made a mistake, not because she tried to kill herself—but because she didn't swallow enough metal and stones to be successful.

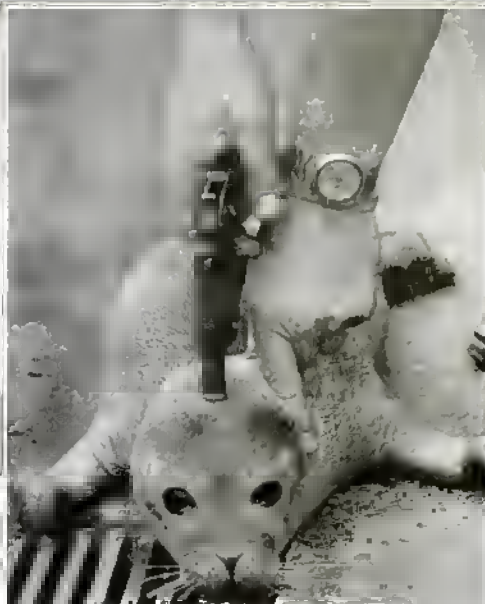
"I'll never marry that man," Marani told newsmen who visited her in the hospital. "He's mean, ugly and old. It's his wrong to make me marry him."

"It's my life—not his," she said. The prospective groom refused to comment on the incident other than to say Abdul Al-Dary, the girl's father, had promised him Marani's hand in marriage "in return for a favor."

Al-Dary was almost as tight-lipped, saying only that his daughters had blindly disappointed him and "I'm no longer worthy of my name."

Horror of the bleeding house

lous "housewarming" dinner. Karen was cheerful as she made out the formal invitations for 40 guests and even sent one to Fordyce, the Penrose attor-

ney. The dinner would have been memorable for the fancy foods and gay chatter alone—but it was the terror that struck after the guests had been warned that made it a terrifying event.

Karen suddenly screamed and pointed to the widening scarlet stain that had appeared on the tablecloth.

Then, screams from the other guests filled the room as they looked up at the source of the stain. On the ceiling was a red patch, dripping drops of blood onto the tablecloth.

Corliss and several other men raced upstairs to the old master bedroom to find the source of the horror.

Meanwhile, Paul Fordyce, the Penroses' lawyer, sat trembling in his seat, his face as white as death.

The men returned from their search more baffled than ever. There was no apparent cause for the cascade of dripping blood.

Suddenly, old Fordyce collapsed and was rushed to the hospital.

The next day, he lived long enough to confess to the terrible deed he had committed eight years earlier.

He had quietly been embroiling the Penroses' friends and Buford Penrose had discovered the crime.

Tormented by jail, Fordyce surprised the Penroses in their bedroom one night in 1923 and killed them.

Then, he gruesomely barked their bodies into pieces and threw the ghastly remains into the Savannah River.

His confession explained the Penroses' disappearance, but no one could explain the red stain on the ceiling and the blood that had dripped on the tablecloth.

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Two women charged in separate shockers

Authorities charged a mother with assault after they said a sleep clinic's hidden video camera caught her in the act of smothering her sleeping baby.

Officials in St. Paul, Minn., said the videotape shows Jane Wilkes, a 36-year-old occupational therapist, picking up her sleeping, year-old son, Matthew, and pressing his nose and mouth against her chest until he lost consciousness.

The baby struggled to escape before his tiny body stiffened and then went limp.

The boy managed to come to on his own.

The bizarre scene took place in the sleeping disorder laboratory of Children's Hospital in St. Paul.

Authorities said the baby was hospitalized after suffering a night mysterious respiratory attacks since he was 7 weeks old.

Doctors were suspicious because they could find nothing physically wrong with Matthew.

Prosecutor Tom Foley said Mrs. Wilkes appears to be suffering from a rare psychiatric disorder that causes her to seek praise from others for coming to the aid of her child when he's ill.

"In this case, everybody believes a small child has a serious illness, and it brings gratification to the mother," the prosecutor said. "She acts like a model mother being able to take care of this sick child."

Mrs. Wilkes revived Matthew on several instances when he stopped breathing and paramedics arrived to resuscitate the boy on other occasions, authorities said.

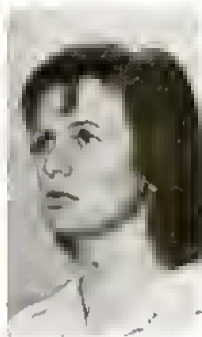
The mother, who faces a possible maximum sentence of three years if convicted, was released on the conditions that she get live at home and that visits with her son be supervised by two adults.

A week before Mrs. Wilkes' arrest in St. Paul, authorities in Des Moines, Iowa, charged Tanya Reid, a 30-year-old nurse, with child endangerment for cutting off her little boy's air.

Officials said they believe Mrs. Reid suffers from the same psychiatric disorder as Mrs. Wilkes. Prosecutor

Malcolm Haas said Mrs. Reid's 2-year-old son has been hospitalized about 20 times.

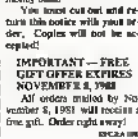

Good news for geezers — aspirin may be miracle cure for senility

Researchers have found still another use for everyday aspirin: It can cure senility!

An astounding new study reveals that the common headache cure can stop and even reverse the steatmindness, memory loss and behavioral deterioration suffered by 30 percent of senility patients.

According to Dr. John S. Moya of Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Tex., a regular dose of one aspirin a day brings about a significant change in old folks who suffer from a form of senility called multi-infarct dementia. This disease is caused by tiny blood clots inside the head and aspirin

apparently stabilizes the blood flow inside the brain.

"The public should now be aware that dementia is not a hopeless disease," Dr. Moya said in announcing the results of a research study involving the drug. He recommended that people have senile relatives evaluated to see if aspirin can help them.

Dr. Moya selected a group of 70 elderly patients for his study, which began three years ago. Half the patients received an aspirin a day and

the others did not, he told the American Heart Association at a recent conference on stroke. "After three years, it was quite apparent that the aspirin-treated group did significantly better," he said. "We stopped the study for ethical reasons. It wasn't safe to go on with it."

Dr. Moya found that ten times as many patients in the untreated group died over the three-year period of the study as those in the aspirin group. He also found that 14 levels of the aspirin taken rose 16 percent, while the untreated patients suffered a decline of 5 percent.

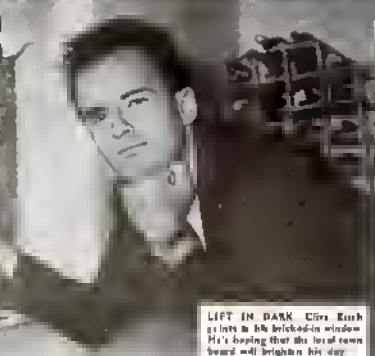

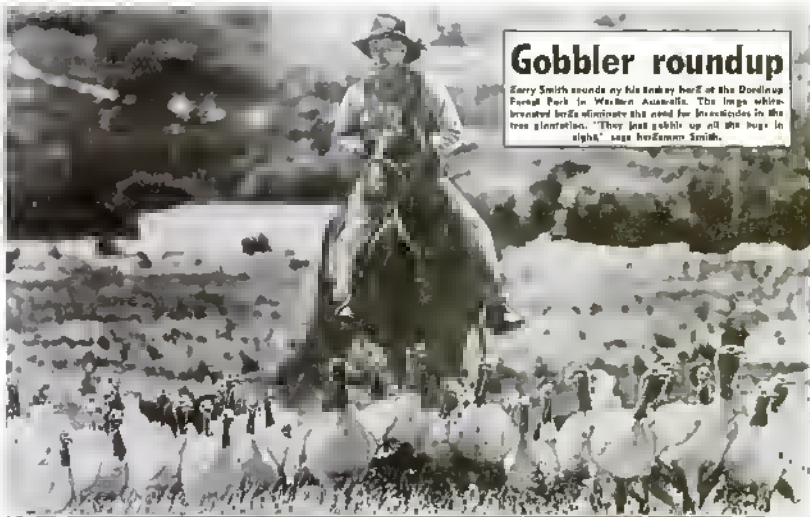

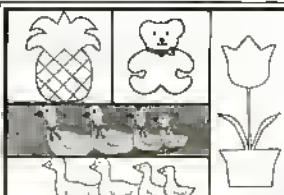

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Brave mom rebuilds her life after tragic fire wiped out her family

Back from the ashes

Four years ago a raging fire robbed Linda Schroeder of everything she loved: her husband Tom, her five small children and her home.

But the tragic blaze couldn't destroy her will to survive and rebuild her life in memory of the family she lost.

Today Linda, 35, dedicates her spare time to teaching children near her home in Elyria, Ohio, with information on how to escape a fire in their homes.

"If I save one life, my kids and my husband won't have died in vain," she told *THE NEWS*. "I'm trying to get the message to kids not to hide from fires like my children did."

Brown Linda has tried to put tragedy behind her. She opened her own pet store to fill hours left empty when her family died. She began to date again and although she has not found any man to equal Tom, fortune blessed her with another child — a boy named Joshua, now 2.

"He's a handful, but he fills the emptiness," Linda said proudly. "He's now the love of my life."

"I never thought I would have another child, but he is a great comfort to me. He has the same bright blue eyes that all my other kids had."

The nightmare fire that changed Linda's life came on March 5, 1984.

Linda had a wake-up call when the alarm and then passed out. Her husband apparently dropped her out the window when she lost consciousness, then died while trying to save his children. For Linda, the loss was horrifying.

"Words cannot convey the grief and utter desolation I felt," Linda said. "I was widowed, childless and horribly alone. Nothing seemed real or solid. Part of me wanted to join my departed family."

"But I went on because Tom wouldn't have had any other way. I did it for him. I had to put my loss in the proper place — the past."

Linda still treasures the photographs of her lost children, still visits the grave where her family is buried, still phoned for the husband she married when she was 17. But she can go on now, she says. She can face the future.

"I'm not a strong person," she confessed. "I've had my ups and downs. But Tom is still in my life, what he taught me, I still carry with me."

"Somewhere in the center of my being, I find the strength to deal with my memories and each time I do I find a little more whole."

Bachelor marriagee Barry Joe Raynor swears he wasn't bombed on booze when a cop nabbed him for drunk driving — he'd been guzzling gasoline.

A Breathalyzer's needle showed his blood-alcohol level was 23 percent — well above the legal level of 1 percent when he was arrested in Sandpoint, Idaho.

"But that was because I'd been sponging regular unleaded gasoline from my gas tank to the carburetor and swallowed some of the stuff," Barry Joe, 23, told a jury.

To prove his point, Barry Joe had his lawyers bring an ounce of unleaded regular gasoline to the Bonner County jail, and he drank it.

"Twenty minutes later the Breathalyzer showed his blood-alcohol level was 31 percent — three times the legal limit," said attorney Jonathan Cottle.

Barry Joe didn't get the mileage he expected from the jury. They were impressed but not convinced he wasn't a wee bit more than 100% when the cops arrested him. They found him guilty of drunk driving.

The officer who taped Barry Joe's arrest and played a role in the jury. "They could hear him screaming and cursing the officer," said Cottle.

In two-child families, couples with two daughters have a greater divorce risk, followed by couples with a son and a daughter. Couples with only sons had a better shot at lasting marriages.

Children generally make a marriage more stable because there is a mutual effort in rearing them. If the child is a boy,
