

Tragedy of the boy with the big ears!

None of his classmates are laughing little Simon Boot about his "sticking-out ears" anymore. Instead, they're shedding tears of sorrow and shame — because the one least they treated so cruelly now lies dead in his grave!

The 12-year-old boy died at London's Queen Elizabeth Military Hospital where an operation had hoped to transform him into what he had wanted to be more than anything else in the world — just a regular kid ... one who didn't stand out from the crowd.

Simon was a perky lisp blessed with freckles on his nose, mismatched in his eyes and a shy little-boy smile.

But his ears that jutted out just a bit too far — an odd mishap of nature that turned him into a laughing stock and pain.

Simon called them "big sticking-out ears" and his

hateful taunts and taases they sparked from the other kids, jested him," said his godfather, 25-year-old dad Douglas, a sergeant in the British Army. "He had received the sort of thing that sort of thing bothered him."

Then, a nurse brought the shattering news that something had gone terribly wrong — Simon had suffered a stroke, resulting in the death of his heart and a pool of blood in his brain.

He was taken to the intensive care unit where he died without his eyes registered once.

In his old neighborhood and in the playground and classrooms where Simon was taunted by his peers, there are pretty much the same as there were 12 years ago ... with one exception.

The kids aren't laughing Simon Boot about his "big sticking-out ears" any more.

Churchgoers were astounded when they responded to the cries of a child coming from behind a church altar — and discovered an adorable toddler abandoned there.

The little boy, about 15 months old, wore a gold bracelet with the name Austin. He was found in the rectory of San Francisco's St. Dominic's Church at about 8 a.m. while Mass was being celebrated in the adjoining chapel.

"He cried through the Mass and people kept looking around wondering why the mother wasn't doing something," said Rev. LaSalle Raissey, pastor of the church. "Someone finally got a nacyard enough to check."

Members of the congregation found the little boy, dressed in blue overalls, yellow socks and multicolor sneakers, lying near the sanctuary altar. He had no identification other than the bracelet.

"There was no note, no bag of clothing," said Michael Hancock, an investigator for the San Francisco Department of Social Services.

"We got off press releases

about him to try to locate his mother."

Publicity and police investigations eventually established the dark-haired baby's identity, but Hancock said he wasn't permitted to divulge anything about the little boy's background.

"There were special circumstances," he said. "The boy has been placed with relatives and he's doing fine. Later on, officials will decide whether he should go back to his mother."

Space expert tells his wife during custody fight:

A rocket scientist planned to turn all his children into outer space rather than let his wife take custody of them after they were divorced.

Incredibly, police said Dr. Axel Lebeck came closer to carrying out his scheme than his wife and the authorities would like to think.

He singlehandedly amazified almost \$1 million in rocket parts from a top aerospace firm and was actually assembling the spaceship in a field behind his farm.

"It's hard to imagine but the man was dead serious about putting his two children in orbit," said Inspector Peter Kestig, told reporters in Muri, West Germany.

"He stole hundreds of parts and components from his employer. He had a complete engine in his barn just

waiting to be installed when we caught him."

Dr. Lebeck didn't deny the theft in his alleged statements. He told reporters that he was dead set against his estranged wife taking custody of their children and

was willing to go to any lengths to prevent it.

"I have nothing to apologize for," said the 32-year-old scientist.

"Everybody knows that the mother gets the children when a couple divorces. You just couldn't let that happen — not without a fight, anyway."

The expert was charged with grand theft of the rocket parts and released from jail on his own recognizance. His children, Maria, 13, and Jorg, 11, were returned to their mother by a judge's order.

But Stefanie Lebeck, his 42-year-old wife, lashed out at Lebeck — claiming that the scientist's plan to rocket

their children into space was yet another example of his "crazy" that prompted her to seek a divorce in the first place.

Nicholas Marquez Sr. has also been charged with failing to register his handgun.

Loneliness is more risky than smoking

Scientists have isolated a new killer: loneliness.

New research reveals that being socially isolated rivals established risk factors like cigarettes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol levels, being overweight and neglecting exercise in causing serious health problems.

Sociologists at the University of Michigan concluded that the risks of loneliness are "stronger than the relative risks for all causes of mortality reported in cigarette smoking."

A human rights advocate says Soviet scientists have transplanted a chimp's head on a man's body in one of the most horrifying medical experiments on record.

"The Russians have never been restricted by ethics or respect for human life but this time they've gone too far," Dr. Herman Lusk told reporters in Amberg, West Germany.

"They conducted the transplant on August 20," he added, "and according to my sources, the patient is still alive."

Soviet officials angrily denounced Dr. Lusk's allegation, but he produced both written and photographic evidence to support his claims.

Documents smuggled from a research facility east of Moscow contain a step-by-step description of the bizarre transplant experiment.

And a shocking series of photos taken after the operation clearly depict a human body topped with a chimp's neck and head.

Dr. Viktor Makarov is a former Soviet surgeon who emigrated to West Germany last year. He told reporters that Soviet scientists have conducted head-transplant experiments in the past and will continue to do so unless "God-jeering people everywhere express their desire to quit."

"The most recent transplant is particularly gruesome but it doesn't surprise me in the least," continued the doctor.

"I seriously doubt that the patient will live more than a few months because the animal head will almost certainly be rejected by the human body."

"But this sort of research is very important to the Soviet medical establishment and will definitely go on. It is part of an attempt to extend life itself in the pursuit of ultimate power."

Western intelligence sources con-

clude that the Soviets have been con-

ducting head transplant experiments since the early 1950s. Similar research has been totally banned in the United States, they went on to say.

In spite of Soviet denials, Dr. Lusk has called on individuals and human rights groups worldwide to condemn the Soviet medical practice.

"In the name of God and everything decent we've got to stop this madness," he said.


Cops find dead man holding floral bouquet

World leaders briefed on 10 UFO hot spots around the world



By BAGAN DUNN

Members of a multi-national task force have determined that UFOs repeatedly visit 10 key areas around the world — and speculate that these hot spots might be strategic points in an extraterrestrial plot to take over the world!

"World leaders have been briefed and they are only alarmed," group spokesman Konrad Schild told reporters in Geneva, Switzerland.

"We aren't at all confident that we have the military or diplomatic means to protect ourselves if extraterrestrials do decide to invade planet Earth," he added.

"The one thing we do know is that we must deal with this threat from a posture of strength and knowledge, not complacency, ignorance or fear."

The research team is composed

of representatives of 23 nations worldwide, including Switzerland, France, Spain, Britain, China, The United States, Soviet Union and Brazil.

Their elected head of the group is no less a figure than Chinese Communist party chief Deng Xiaoping, who reportedly has discussed the situation with Soviet boss Mikhail Gorbachev, President Ronald Reagan and leading researchers around the world.

According to spokesman Schild, the UFO group based its findings on a 16-year study of UFO sightings and encounters which revealed the following hot spots:

• New Mexico: More than 175 UFO sightings highlighted recent allegations that space aliens actually have a secret UFO base where human beings are subjected to bizarre human experiments.

Sightings and encounter data date back to 1957, when the U.S. government recovered 16 bodies of these space aliens from the wreckage of a secret aircraft.

• Russia: 1,000 sightings. On April 20, 1983, Soviet lights fell allegedly from minutes of a high-speed UFO. The harassing encounters have not yet stopped at the Baikonur Cosmodrome.

• Rio de Janeiro, Brazil: At least 250 of the 500 UFO sightings recorded over the past decade have occurred in Rio. In the past two years alone, military jets have performed dozens of the sightings in the area.

• Chile: 100 sightings. On April 20, 1983, Soviet lights fell allegedly from minutes of a high-speed UFO. The harassing encounters have not yet stopped at the Baikonur Cosmodrome.

• China: 1,000 sightings. "We have a secret base in the mountains of Yunnan," says Dr. Wang, and the Santa Clara, China, said as legend. "We need it to get them out."

A veteran police officer said he simply couldn't bear the prospect of putting his two young sons through a messy divorce — and decided to have his wife murdered instead.

"I knew I could no longer live with Faye and I knew that I could not wait on my sons," Hans Bredemann told Canadian authorities after his arrest in Edmonton.

Bredemann, 38, was sentenced to 10 years after pleading guilty to attempted murder charges in the attack on his wife, Faye, who was shot in the hand and stomach.

Officer Bredemann's 35-year-old girlfriend, Elizabeth McLean, is accused of passing the trigger and is scheduled to be tried later this year.

In a statement to investigators, Bredemann said the murder plot was hatched in desperation — because he couldn't "walk out on his marriage and leave his two young sons behind."

"I tried to explain the situation to them but they began to tremble and tears started forming in their eyes," Bredemann explained.

"That look on their faces has haunted me ever since and eventually desperation took its final course."

"I was possessed by a force that totally overrode me," the 17-year veteran of the Edmonton police force said.

"To the scariest guy in the world, I just couldn't see nothing, you know, like 'no other way out,'" Bredemann said.

"Ged, it sounds crazy. Absoluteley crazy, you know. Like I was in a Hitchcock movie," he said. "I just can't."

Officials in St. Paul, Minn., said the videotape shows Jane Wilken, a 36-year-old occupational therapist, picking up her sleeping 2-year-old son, Matthew, and pressing his nose and mouth against her chest until he lost consciousness.

The baby struggled to escape before his tiny body stiffened and then went limp.

The boy managed to come to on his own.

The bizarre scene took place in the sleeping disorders laboratory of Children's Hospital in St. Paul.

Authorities said the baby was hospitalized after suffering eight mysterious respiratory attacks since he was 7 weeks old.

Doctors were suspicious because they could find nothing physically wrong with Matthew.

Prosecutor Tom Foley said Mrs. Wilken appears to be suffering from a rare psychiatric disorder that causes her to seek pleasure from others for coming to the aid of her child when he's ill.

"In this case, everybody believes a small child has a serious illness, and it has got reflection in the mother," the prosecutor said. "She acts like a model mother being able to take care of this sick child."

Mrs. Wilken revived Matthew on several occasions when he stopped breathing and paramedics arrived to resuscitate the boy on other occasions, authorities said.

The mother, who faces a possible maximum sentence of three years if convicted, was released on the condition that she not live at home and that visits with her son be supervised by two adults.

A week before Mrs. Wilken's arrest, in St. Paul, authorities in Des Moines, Iowa, charged Terrie Reid, a 30-year-old nurse, with child endangerment for cutting off her little boy's air.

Officials said they believe Mrs. Reid suffers from the same psychiatric disorder as Mrs. Wilken. Prosecutors

Melodee Hines said Mrs. Reid's 21-year-old son has been hospitalized.

"He would help resuscitate him," the prosecutor said.

"But the child has nothing physically wrong with him and hasn't been placed in

an oxygen tent," the prosecutor said.

"After cutting off the child's air, it's only wrong with him and hasn't been placed in

an oxygen tent," the prosecutor said.

After the boy was hospitalized, he was placed in foster care. The prosecutor added that Mrs. Reid, who was released from custody, faces a mandatory 10-year prison term if she is convicted of child endangerment.

Good news for geezers — aspirin may be miracle cure for senility

Researchers have found still another use for everyday aspirin: It can cure senility!

An astounding new study reveals that the common headache cure can stop and even reverse the absentmindedness, memory loss and behavioral disorientation suffered by 20 percent of senility patients.

According to Dr. John S. Moyes of Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, the regular dose of one aspirin a day brings about a significant change in old folks who suffer from a form of senility called multi-infarct dementia. The disease is caused by tiny blood clots inside the head and

rin apparently stabilizes the illness by increasing blood flow to the brain.

"The public should now be aware that dementia is not a hopeless disease," Dr. Moyes said in announcing the results of a research study involving the drug. He recommended that people have their relatives consulted to see if aspirin can help them.

Dr. Moyes selected a group of 70 elderly patients for his study, which began three years ago. Half the patients received 1 aspirin a day and

the others did not, he told the American Heart Association at its recent conference on stroke. After three years, it was quite apparent that the aspirin-treated group did significantly better, he said. "We stopped the study for ethical reasons. It wasn't fair to go on with it."

Dr. Moyes found that four times as many patients in the group did not die over the three-year period of the study as those in the aspirin group. He also found that IQ levels of the aspirin-takers rose 18 percent, while the untreated patients suffered a decline of 5 percent.

A goldfish swallower underwent emergency surgery after he gulped down a piranha by mistake.

Doctors said the voracious fish chewed a hole in Cleber Salzani's stomach, almost causing him to bleed to death before he got medical attention.

"He's really very lucky to be alive," Dr. Dario Campos, local reporter in Santa Maria, Brazil.

"The piranha opened a thumb-sized hole in his stomach before gastric acids killed him."

If he hadn't come when he did, there is no doubt that he would be dead right now."

The bizarre drama unfolded when Salzani decided to impress his friends by swallowing goldfish at a party. He

ordered several dozen from a pet shop, which apparently threw in a four-inch piranha by mistake.

"I've swallowed goldfish for years without any problems whatsoever," said Salzani. "I knew something was

wrong this time when I felt a terrible pain in my stomach. It felt like a hot poker. And when I started spitting up blood I knew I was in serious trouble."

In fact, witnesses said Salzani, 26, doubled over in

agonizing spasms after he swallowed the piranha. Stunned friends rushed him to a hospital, where doctors opened him up, stitched the bite wound and removed the fish from his stomach.

"I've never seen anything like it," said Dr. Campos.

"It was almost as if the piranha had been trying to eat Mr. Salzani from the inside out."

Said Salzani, "This isn't going to stop me from swallowing goldfish but I'll eat them out."

"Next time I'll make damn sure what I've got in my hand before it goes down my throat."

Back from the ashes

Four years ago a raging fire robbed Linda Schraeder of everything she loved: her husband Tom, her five small children and her home.

But the tragic blaze couldn't destroy her will to survive and rebuild her life in memory of the family she lost.

Today Linda, 35, dedicates her spare time to raising children near her home in Elyria, Ohio, with information on how to escape a fire in their home.

"If I save one life, my kids and my husband won't have died in vain," she told The NEWS. "I'm trying to get the message to kids not to hide from fire like my children did."

Young Linda had tried to put tragedy behind her. She opened her new grocery store to fill hours left empty when her family died. She began to date again and although she has not found a boy to replace Tom, fortune blessed her with another child — a boy named Joshua, now 2.

"He's a handful, but he fills the emptiness," Linda said proudly. "He's now the love of my life.

"I never thought I would have another child, but he is a great comfort to me. He has the same bright disposition that all my other kids had."

Ample Ingrid was a very normal young woman till about a year ago, her mom says.


"She was a happy-go-lucky lady with a big smile and an active social life," Mary Smith recalled.

Mechanic swears he drank gas, not booze

Bachelder mechanic Barry Joe Raynor swears he wasn't bombed on booze when he cop nabbed him in drunk driving — he'd been guzzling gasoline.

A Breathalyzer reading showed his blood-alcohol level was .23 percent — well above the legal level of .1 percent when he was arrested in Steamboat, Idaho.

"But that was because I'd been siphoning regular unleaded gasoline from my gas tank to the carburetor and swallowed some of the stuff," Barry Joe, 23, told a jury.

To prove his point, Barry Joe had his lawyer bring an ounce of unleaded regular gasoline to the Bonner County jail, and he drank it.

"Twenty minutes later the Breathalyzer showed his blood-alcohol level was .31 percent — three times the legal limit," said attorney Jonathan Coltrille.

Berry Joe didn't get the mifur he expected from the jury. They found him guilty but not convinced he wasn't a wee bit more than tipsy when the cops arrested him. They found him guilty of drunk driving.

The officer had taped Barry Joe's arrest and played it to the jury. "They could hear him screaming and cursing the officer," said Coltrille.

Berry Joe claimed he siphoned gas from his car and poured it in the carburetor to get the car started," said Coltrille. "He swallowed about a half cup of gasoline."

Attorney Coltrille said he was amazed gasoline had such an effect on a person's blood-alcohol level. Gasoline is blended from natural gas and petroleum.

Berry Joe, who could be fined \$500 and jailed for 10 days, is chockered he got it raw deal.

"They've convicted another innocent person," he said. "I'm not too happy about it."

An analysis of 1960 census data reveals sons appear to make marriages more stable, according to sociologist Dr. S. Phillip Morgan of the University of Pennsylvania.

In two-child families, couples with two daughters have a greater divorce risk, believed to be due to the lack of a daughter. Couples with only sons had a better shot at a lasting marriage.

Children generally make a marriage more stable because there is a continual effort in nurturing them. If the child is a boy,
